Lee was invited to become an SNRC member due to his voluntary on-the-air "audit" of the repeaters contained in the SNRC database. Lee

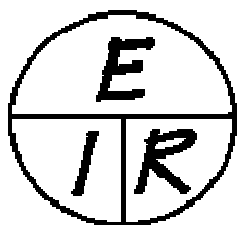

Repeater Coordination Activity

Between late July and early September, the SNRC acted on the following 7 requests:

- Approved a frequency change to K6JSI repeater atop the Plaza Hotel downtown from 145.49 to 145.25 due to interference issues with a 145.49 repeater near St. George, UTAH;
- Approved 447.950 for K6JSI repeater at Blue Diamond;
- Approved 146.97 for KE7MWY at his address in Henderson;
- Approved 449.475 for N6LXX on Low Potosi;
- Approved 447.025 for KI6VEJ at his address on W. Tropical
- Approved 147.03 for WB6EGR for repeater at his address NW of Las Vegas.
