**March 2011 Minutes**

Following are the minutes of a regular meeting of the officers and appointed frequency coordinators of SOUTHERN NEVADA REPEATER COUNCIL, INC., hereinafter SNRC, held at 8:00AM on March 12, 2011.

The following persons were present: Bill Smith, W7HMY, Nat Talpis, W7OQF both being officers of the corporation. In addition, coordinator, Blayne Ence, KG7SS, web site/database manager Steve Gebhard, WB9STH. Treasurer and coordinator Frank Kostelac, N7ZEV and Lee Dusbabek N7LD were unable to attend.

Meeting was called to order at 8:00AM by Bill, W7HMY.

The minutes of the last General Meeting were not read.

Bill gave the Treasurer's report in Frank's absence.

**Old Business**

1. The Officers and Coordinators present discussed the pros and cons of only displaying known coordinated and operational repeaters on the SNRC website. By unanimous vote, it was agreed that the SNRC website databases should display all know coordinated repeaters whether or not operational status has been verified.

Steve said he would make the changes to the website databases to show all coordi-

nated repeaters in all databases on the web-site.

2. The portable repeater policy was re-visited. After the last meeting, and due to an exchange of emails between us, the consensus was to adopt a portable repeater policy similar to the Arizona policy. Following a discussion of the need for a policy similar to that implemented by the Arizona frequency

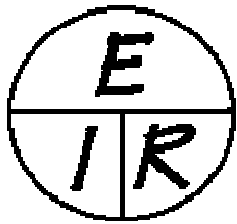
coordinating body, a vote was taken and we voted to adopt a policy similar to Arizona's.

## Repeater Coordination Activity

Shorty Stouffer, K6JSI requested two 420 link frequencies Nat approved this request. (Bill emailed formal approval letter that same day).

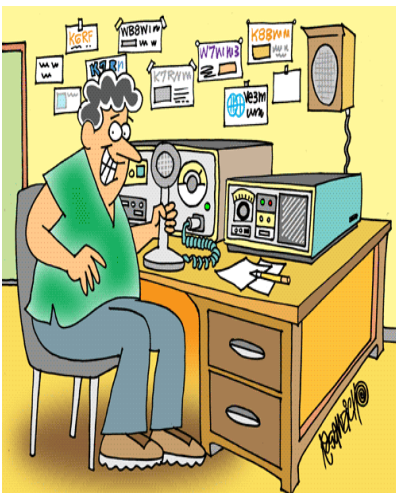
Kent Johnson, W7AOR requested the following:

- A. Coordination of a new location for his IRLP repeater on 447.000/442.000 MHz, from Frenchman Mtn. area to Blue Diamond Hill at 4,875'MSL . This is an existing repeater but it looks like the elevation will increase;
- B. Coordination for two link frequencies.
- C. An open coordination for the current repeater location.



Shorty Stouffer, K6JSI, requested coordination for 445.500/440.500 MHz on the Plaza Hotel with a pl of 100Hz.
